

a) General – all four licensing objectives (b, c, d and e) (please read guidance note 11)

The proposed PLH and DPS, Mr Vigitharan EESWARAKUMARAN is a personal license holder, his license granted by Stafford Council, number

He intends to run the premises as a local convenience/off license store, serving the local community alongside holiday makers ad day trippers as passing trade.

Mr EESWARAKUMARAN will have responsibility for the day to day,

running of the business and overseeing the sale of alcohol.

As the proposed DPS and PLH, he is a long standing and experienced personal licence holder and is fully appraised of the four licensing objectives. He competently owns and runs another licensed premises, whose license was granted by the South Somerset Council, which operates without issue and within the licensing objectives.

The PLH/DPS will regularly keep abreast of legislation changes.

The PLH/DPS will complete staff training for himself and his employees on a regular basis, to refresh their knowledge and keep up to date with their responsibilities under the Licensing Act.

The PLH/DPS will keep regular contact with Council Licensing Officers and other responsible authorities throughout the term of the licence, to be appraised of, and to stay up to date with, current council requirements.

Contact number and addresses provided in the application are the personal numbers and home address of the PLH/ DPS in order that he is always contactable.

A CCTV system will be properly installed, maintained and regularly updated at the premises with 10 cameras.

CCTV will always operate when the premises is operating for licensable activity.

CCTV to cover the entrance, exit point and till and give good facial imagers of all customers.

CCTV to cover all area where alcohol is displayed, paid for and served from.

10 CCTV cameras to cover all areas where the public have access to and the immediate vicinity outside to the front of the premises. 'CCTV in use', warning signs to be fitted in public places.

Recordable images to be downloaded in a suitable format and such recordings to be handed to any member of a responsible authority upon their request and without undue delay and all recording images to be kept for 31 days.

All recording to be of good image quality to provide evidential value and seasonally updated with the correct time and date.

Staff will be trained to use and download images from the installed CCTV system, and Mr Vigitharan EESWARAKUMARAN will be contactable 24 hours a day.

An incident and refusals log will be maintained at the premises and a written record of any incidents which occur. Any refusal of a sale of alcohol will be appropriately recorded in the refusals log. Where it is deemed appropriate the refusal and incident log will be made available to a member of a responsible authority upon their request, without undue delay. Sales are for 'off' the premises consumption only, between the hours of 07.00 and 23.00 hours daily.

c) Public safety

The store shall be free from obstacles that may cause a trip or fall hazard to the public.

A fire extinguisher shall be kept at the premises and shall be checked and maintained on a 12 monthly basis.

The store will be a smoke free zone. A local fire safety firm will be contacted and a request for a Fire Officer to update the fire risk assessment will be submitted. This will be completed in accordance with the guidance/information

d) The prevention of public nuisance

Waste rubbish regularly collected.

Daily checks shall be undertaken to ensure no litter is allowed to accumulate at the front or the rear of the premises.

Comply with fire safety regulations.

Fire and safety equipment serviced on a 12 monthly basis.

e) The protection of children from harm

The 'Challenge 25 Scheme' will be in place. Photographic i.d. will be required to be produced for any person who appears underage, to include photo driving licence, passport, or photographic 'pass' logo with the person's date of birth.

The premises will display an A4 size page listing acceptable forms of i.d. to include different nationality's forms of i.d.

'Challenge 25' signs will be prominently displayed.

A till prompt system will be in place regarding age restricted products to alert staff to ask for i.d. if required.

All members of staff shall be trained on a twelve-monthly basis on the refusals of alcohol sales, and this recorded in the refusal log. All staff who make alcohol sales will have full knowledge of 'Challenge 25' to ensure no sales of alcohol are made to underage persons and to adhere to their responsibilities regarding licensing legislation and the licensing objectives.

Induction/instruction of staff in the 'Challenge 25' scheme will occur before new staff commence duties at the premises involving sales of alcohol.

All staff training to be documented and for the training documents to be available to a member of a responsible authority upon request and without undue delay.

Refusal log entries will contain the following: details of the time and date of the refusal, identify of the member of staff making the refusal, details of the alcohol the refusal referred to.

The log will be available for inspection by any member of a responsible authority upon request and without undue delay.

The log will be regularly checked and signed by the Designated Premise Supervisor.

This application cannot be used to vary the licence so as to extend the period for which the licence has effect or to vary substantially the premises to which it relates. If you wish to

make that type of change to the premises licence, you should make a new premises licence application under section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003.

- 1. You do not have to pay a fee if the only purpose of the variation for which you are applying is to avoid becoming liable for the late night levy
- 2. Describe the premises. For example, the type of premises, its general situation and layout and any other information which could be relevant to the licensing objectives.  - Boxing or Wrestling Entertainment: no licence is required for a contest, exhibition or display of Greco-Roman wrestling, or freestyle wrestling between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000. Combined fighting sports defined as a contest, exhibition or display which combines boxing or wrestling with one or more martial arts are licensable as a boxing or wrestling entertainment rather than an indoor sporting event.
 - Live music: no licence permission is required for:
 - o a performance of unamplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, on any premises.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
 - Recorded Music: no licence permission is required for:
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser

- gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
- o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school proprietor or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
- Dance: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500. However, a performance which amounts to adult entertainment remains licensable.
- Cross activity exemptions: no licence is required between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, with no limit on audience size for:
 - o any entertainment taking place on the premises of the local authority where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the local authority;
 - o any entertainment taking place on the hospital premises of the health care provider where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the health care provider;
 - o any entertainment taking place on the premises of the school where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the school proprietor; and
 - o any entertainment (excluding films and a boxing or wrestling entertainment) taking place at a travelling circus, provided that (a) it takes place within a moveable structure that accommodates the audience, and (b) that the travelling circus has not been located on the same site for more than 28 consecutive days.
